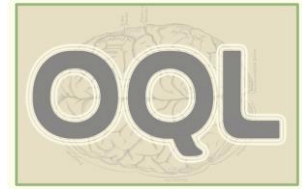

At reader's discretion, there may be multiple repeats given in the event of technology issues, but the reader should be notified of the tech issue immediately. Question rereads should not be used tactically.
